Gentlemen:—To give you a correct report I respectfully call your attention to the condition of funds at this date. The liabilities contracted refer to the contracts made by the city that must be taken care of up to July 1st next, such as salaries, garbage collections, lighting, water, main sewer bonds and land contracts, in other words the actual contracts that must be taken care of between now and the time when the city tax will be collected in July but does not include the bills presented each month for care of horses, feed for same, repairing, in fact incidentals that come each pay day. The only money that can possibly be collected between now and then is \$3,649.99, replacement money paid in settlement of liquor license cases, and liquor license money which is an unknown quantity at present and cannot be relied upon. While I am heartily in favor of necessary improvements I call your attention to the condition of the funds and
