COMMUNICATION FROM MAYOR.

Ann Arbor, Mich., August 7th, 1909.
To the Honorable Common Council:

Gentlemen—I regret that an accident and injury to some of our citizens has compelled me to call your Honorable Body in special session.

The collapse of the east section of the wagon bridge on Wall street over the Huron river demands of us knowledge of the facts causing such accident, therefore, I would suggest that your Honorable Body make a thorough investigation of the cause or causes of the accident, and that you take such action for the repair or reconstruction of the bridge as you deem best.

It was an unfortunate accident for the woman and children who were caught in the bridge, but all ought to be thankful that they got out as well as they did, as it seemed almost impossible for any one to escape alive from such a mass of broken wood and iron.

I am pleased to be able to inform you that at this writing the doctors who have the injured ones in their care report that they do not think any serious or permanent injury will result to any of their patients. I join with you in extending to the injured ones our sympathy, and wish them all a speedy recovery.
