Resolved, further, that the City Engineer cause all needful surveys, maps, measurements and estimates to be made, and report the same to the Council with all convenient dispatch.

By Ald. Smith: Resolved, that one hundred dollars be appropriated from the Poor fund to pay for services of nurse in visiting and attending the sick poor of the city, and that one warrant for fifty dollars be drawn January or February, 1910, and the other warrant for fifty dollars be drawn in July or August, 1910. Adopted as follows: Yeas—Ald. Georg, Stark, Sweet, Pipp, Sherk, Smith, Blaich, Lutz, Pres. Mills, 9. Nays, none.
