All moneys collected for the use of the city shall be paid into the city treasury ,and no moneys shall paid from be The treasury unless it shall have previously appropriated by the common council to the purpose for which it shall be drawn. The treasurer shall pay out no money except upon the written warrant of the mayor and the city clerk, which warrant shall specify the fund from which the money is to be paid: Provided, That school moneys shall be paid to the treasurer of school district number one of the city of Ann Arbor, upon the warrant of the president and secretary of said board. The common council may, at any regular meeting thereof, by resolution duly adopted by a majority of all the members elect, authorize the issuing of bonds to the amount not exceeding one hundred and fifty thousand dollars outstanding at any one time, for the purpose of paving any alley, street or streets in such city, such bonds to run for a period not exceeding ten years from the date of their issue, and at a rate of interest not exceeding five per-cent, per annum, and the common council for the purpose of carrying out this provision may pass such ordinance or ordinances as may be deemed necessary.
