From Park Commission—
 Ann Arbor, Mich., Oct. 17, 1910.

To the Common Council of the City
 of Ann Arbor: The new North Boule-
 vard which is now being built on the
 north side of the river, is well under
 way, and will be completed in about
 one month. The location of this
 drive requires the use of a small cor-
 ner of Fairview cemetery, as is shown
 on the accompanying plan. This por-
 tion of the cemetery is on low ground
 and has never been used for burying
 purposes, and probably never will be,

and has never had any care or attention. As the building of this boulevard which will be the finest drive we have had, will be without expense to the city, the Park Commission respectfully ask that permission be given to cross the cemetery property at the points shown on the plans.

Communication—From the Ann Arbor Gas Co. relative to fire protection, received and referred to the Fire and Water committees.

To the Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor: During the recent fire at the plant of this company, it was apparent that we did not have sufficient fire protection. The nearest hydrant to our plant is on Broadway on the opposite side of the river, and although the pressure on the water mains was ample, the long lines of hose required did not furnish sufficient pressure to cope with the fire. Had the fire department brought the steamer to the scene on the first alarm, or had they been able to use it after it arrived, the danger to our plant would have been materially lessened. As this company is a very heavy tax payer in Ann Arbor, we respectfully ask that we be given sufficient fire protection, and that a hydrant be placed on Broadway accessible to our property.
