Ordinance Committee.

Ald. Manwaring presented the following ordinance for its third reading:

An Ordinance to Prohibit the Sale or Setting Off of Fireworks Within the Limits of the City of Ann Arbor: The Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor Ordain—

Sec. 1. No person, firm or corporation shall sell or offer for sale or give away, within the limits of the city of Ann Arbor, any toy cannon, or pistol, firecrackers, torpedoes, roman candles, sky rockets, or any other fireworks, excepting by the written permission of the mayor, which permission shall limit the sale to a special occasion or celebration, and shall be subject to revocation by the mayor at any time.

Sec. 2. No person, firm or corporation shall fire or set off within the limits of the City of Ann Arbor any toy cannon, or pistol, firecrackers, torpedoes, roman candles, sky rockets, or any other fireworks, excepting by the written permission of the mayor, which permission shall limit the firing or setting off of said fireworks to a special occasion or celebration, and shall be subject to revocation by the mayor at any time.

Sec. 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine not exceeding one

hundred dollars and the costs of prosecution; and in imposing any such fine and costs the court may make the further sentence that the offender be imprisoned in the county jail of the County of Washtenaw, until such fine and costs shall be paid, but any such imprisonment shall not exceed 20 days.

Sec. 4. Any ordinance inconsistent with any of the provisions of this ordinance is hereby repealed.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on and after ten days from legal publication.

The Chair put the question, "Shall this ordinance pass?"

Lighting Committee.

To the Common Council: Gentlemen—Your lighting committee, to whom the petitions for the following lights were referred, respectfully recommends that tungsten lights be placed as follows: At northeast corner of Brook and Summit sts.; on Mack road midway between Wilmot and Elm sts.; at junction of Phillip st. and Ann Arbor railroad crossing; at corner of Catherine and Observatory sts.; on east side of E. University av. between Michigan av. and Prospect st. near Prospect; on the east side of 12th st. between N. University av. and E. Washington st.; on the northeast corner of Madison and Thompson sts.; at the corner of S. Division and Benjamin sts.; on E. Kingsley st. at John Lawrence's alley; the foregoing to be Tungsten lights.

We further recommend that the following Tungsten lights be installed under the direction of the City Marshal: In alley back of Walkover shoe store; in alley back of Wagner Bros. on S. Main st.

We also recommend that a Tungsten light be placed in front of Quarry drug store on corner of N. University av. and State st. and that light be changed from present location near Monroe st. on E. University av. to northwest corner of E. University av. and Monroe st.

Committee on Detention Hospital.

To the Honorable the Common Council: Gentlemen—Your committee, to whom was referred the matter of bonding the city for \$25,000 for a contagious disease hospital, to be built by the University of Michigan on a site furnished by them, report that the Board of Regents and your committee have agreed upon the following:

On condition that the city of Ann Arbor will furnish and turn over to the Regents of the University of Michigan, \$25,000 for the purpose of building a contagious disease hospital in said city, the University of Michigan agrees to furnish a site for the same, build a hospital to cost at least the aforesaid amount, and will equip and maintain it in perpetuity, furnishing necessary medical attendance and nursing.

Such hospital shall be open at any and all times for the reception of any patients taken sick in the city of Ann Arbor with a contagious disease. The number of such patients shall be limited only by the full capacity of such hospital. The rates charged by the University shall always be in accordance with those charged other patients in the other University hospitals receiving similar accommodations.

When such hospital shall not be in use, either in whole or in part, for the care of contagious disease patients, the University shall be free to make use of such part of it as is not occupied as the Regents may see fit. Rules for the control of the hospital shall be made by the Board of Regents.

William H. Murary, Chairman of the Committee.

Ald. Murray moved the adoption of the report.

Adopted as follows: Yeas, Ald Hochrein, Murray, Manwaring, Sherk, Blaich, Paton, Lutz, Pres. Mills, 8. Nays, none.

(Enter Ald. Stark and Sweet.)

By Ald. Murray: Resolved, that a special election be, and the same hereby is called, and will be held on Wednesday, March 1, 1911, in pursuance of the charter of this city, to vote upon the question of raising the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) by loan, such funds when raised to be used for the purpose of constructing a detention hospital, said hospital to be erected upon a site to be furnished by the University of Michigan.

On condition that the city of Ann Arbor will furnish and turn over to the Regents of the University of Michigan \$25,000, for the purpose of building a contagious disease hospital in said city, the University of Michigan agrees to furnish a site for the same, build a hospital to cost at least the aforesaid amount, and will equip and maintain it in perpetuity, furnishing necessary medical attendance and nursing.

Such hospital shall be open at any and all times for the reception of any patients taken sick in the city of Ann Arbor with a contagious disease. The number of such patients shall be limited only by the full capacity of such hospital. The rates charged by the University shall always be in accordance with those charged other patients in the other University hospitals receiving similar accommodations.

When such hospital shall not be in use, either in whole or in part, for the care of contagious disease patients, the University shall be free to make use of such part of it as is not occupied as the Regents may see fit. Rules for the control of the hospital shall be made by the Board of Regents.

Resolved, further, that said election be held in the several wards of the city of Ann Arbor, Mich., as follows:

1st ward, ward voting room, basement of city hall; 2nd ward, ward building on S. Ashley st.; 3rd ward, No. 211 N. Main st., Lutz building; 4th ward, No. 222 Detroit st, Gwinner building; 5th ward, ward building, corner Swift and Pontiac sts.; 6th ward, basement of 6th ward school, E. University av.; 7th ward, ward building on Mary st.

Resolved, further, that the city clerk of said city be and hereby is authorized to issue the usual call for said special election pursuant to the charter of said city, and to cause to be printed ballots for the use of the electors at said special election, which ballots shall be printed upon white paper of equal width and length and shall read:

"FOR THE DETENTION HOSPITAL SPECIAL TAX—YES," and
"FOR THE DETENTION HOSPITAL SPECIAL TAX—NO."

Resolved, further, that the canvass and termination of the vote of said special election be made pursuant to the charter of said city.

Resolved, further, that the polls for

said election be open from 7 o'clock a. m. to 8 o'clock p. m.

Adopted as follows: Yeas, Ald. Stark, Hochrein, Murray, Sweet, Manwaring, Sherk, Blaich, Paton, Lutz, Pres. Mills, 10. Nays, none.

University av.; 7th ward, ward building on Mary st.

Resolved, further, that said registration take place on the 23rd day

of February, 1911, according to the election laws and charter of the city.

Adopted as follows: Yeas, Ald. Stark, Hochrein, Murray, Sweet, Manwaring, Sherk, Blaich, Paton, Lutz, Pres. Mills, 10. Nays, none.
