Resolved, further, and it appearing to this common council that to enable the city of Ann Arbor, during the fiscal year aforesaid, to keep, maintain in good order and repair the several bridges, culverts, sidewalks and cross walks, within the corporate limits of said city, a sum of money in excess of the percentum authorized to be raised under the authority of the city charter is and will be necessary, therefore, Resolved, that by virtue of the authority granted to the common council by the general laws of the state, the sum of twenty five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) be and the same is hereby appropriated for the purpose of maintaining in good order and repair the several bridges, culverts, sidewalks and cross walks, within the corporate limits of the city of Ann Arbor.

Resolved, further, and it is hereby ordered that the several sums of money aforesaid be and the same are hereby levied and assessed upon, on and against the taxable property of the city of Ann Arbor, Michigan, and ordered spread on the tax rolls of the city for the year 1911 and 1912, A. D., for the said several purposes aforesaid, and it is hereby ordered that the several sums be assessed, levied and collected and paid to the city treasurer for the several funds aforesaid. Resolved, further, that the city clerk do certify this resolution and order of appropriation and assessment to the City Assessor, and that when so certified the City Assessor do spread the said several sums of money aforesaid

on and upon the tax rolls of the City of Ann Arbor, Michigan, for the year of 1911, and assess the same against the taxable property of the city of Ann Arbor as the same has been set down in the tax rolls or as the same may be fixed or determined by the board of review of the said city against the respective owners and occupants of the said taxable property pursuant to law. By Ald. Koernke: Resolved, that the Sidewalk committee investigate the necessity of a sidewalk on the west side of North Main st. along the Ann Arbor railroad property, and report the same at next meeting of the council. Adopted.

By Ald. Koernke: Resolved, that the wooden railing at Fountain st. culvert be replaced with a gas pipe railing. Referred to Street committee on motion of Ald. Pipp.

Sprinkling District No. 11.

By Ald. Manwaring: Resolved, That the common council of the city of Ann Arbor do declare that they deem it necessary that S. State st., from E. Washington st., to E. William st. that N. University av., from S. State st., to S. Thayer st., and that E. Liberty st., from S. State st., to Maynard st., should be wet down or sprinkled, to the end that the health and comfort of the people may thereby be conserved, therefore, Resolved, that under the provisions of an ordinance entitled, "An ordinance relative to Street Sprinkling and providing a method of raising by taxation the money to pay the cost and expenses therefor," passed July 17th, 1899, the common council hereby determines that upon the petition of a majority of the foot frontage owners of the taxable land on the above mentioned streets, the said streets shall be sprinkled and wet down, and the costs and expenses therefor shall be assessed and taxed to the owners of the land benefitted thereby.

Resolved, further, that the lands abutting on State st., from E. Washington st., to E. William st.; on N. University av., from S. State st., to S. Thayer st. and on E. Liberty st., from S. State st. to Maynard st., are hereby set aside as a special assessment district, to be known as Street Sprinkling District No. 11.

Resolved, further, that each and all of the lands, tenements, and premises hereinafter mentioned are deemed and declared to be benefitted by such street sprinkling, to the extent of the cost thereof, and all such lands shall constitute and all of the lands hereinafter mentioned are fixed and determined as the district and the special assessment district upon and against which shall be charged and assessed all the costs and expenses of such street sprinkling. That is to say: All that part of the city of Ann Arbor and all the lands, tenements and premises situated in the city of Ann Arbor, state of Michigan, known and bounded as follows, to wit: Lots No. 5, 6, 7 and 8, and that part of lots 2 and 3 as lies east of the east line of Henry S. Dean's land, all in B. 2 S., R. 9 E., Ann Arbor Land Co.'s addition; lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 11, 13, 14, 15 and 16, B. 3 S., R. 9 E., Ann Arbor Land Co.'s addition; lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 9, and 10, except the N. 37 ft of lot 10, the N. 3 rods of lot 7, and the N. 3 rods of the W. 2 1-2 rods of lot 8, all in B. 2 S., R. 10 E. eastern addition, and lots A, B, C, D, E and F., J. S. Orr's subdivision. Adopted as follows: Yeas, Ald. Pipp, Flynn, Sherk, Koernke, Manwaring, Sweet, Goodyear, Hochrein, Ramsay, Murray, Schmid, Lindenschmitt, O'Connor and Pres. Mills. 14. Nays, none.

By Ald. Pipp: Resolved that the repairing of Detroit st. be referred to the Street committee. Adopted.

By Ald. Schmid: Resolved that the city telephone be transferred from Mr. W. E. Howe's residence to that of Wm. H. McIntyre. Adopted as follows: Yeas, Ald. Pipp, Flynn, Sherk, Koernke, Manwaring, Sweet, Goodyear, Hochrein, Ramsay, Murray, Schmid, Lindenschmitt, O'Connor and Pres. Mills. 14. Nays, none.

By Ald. Sherk: Resolved, that two hundred dollars be appropriated for the purchase of Ceder st. and the grading of the same. This sum to be paid upon the receipt of a deed of that portion of Ceder st. not owned by the city at the present time. Moved by Ald. Pipp, that the matter be referred to Park committee with power to act. Adopted as follows: Yeas,

Ald. Pipp, Flynn, Sherk, Koernke, Manwaring, Sweet, Goodyear, Hochrein, Ramsay, Murray, Schmid, Lindenschmitt, O'Connor and Pres. Mills. 14. Nays, none.

Alderman Lindenschmitt called to the chair.

Moved by Ald. Manwaring: That matter of licenses for pop corn wagons and peddlers be referred to the Ordinance committee. Adopted.

President Mills returned to chair.

Moved by Ald. Sweet: That a committee of three be appointed by the chair to look up site for Third ward building for use during caucuses, elections, etc. Adopted and following committee appointed—Ald. Sweet, Koernke and Hochrein.

The council adjourned.
