Sewer Committee Report.

To the common council: Gentlemen—Your committee, to whom the following matters were referred, respectfully report that they have investigated the matter of storm-water sewer on West Second st., and recommend that a cement box be constructed across Second st. at the intersection and north side of Jefferson st. We further recommend that a sanitary sewer be constructed on Murray av. between Washington st. and Liberty st.

Resolved, further, that the City Engineer cause all needful surveys, maps, measurements and estimates to be made, and report the same to the council with all convenient dispatch.

Officers Reports

Hon. Common Council, City: Gentlemen—The shed in the rear of Engine house No. 1 should have a new roof, and this connected with the storm-water sewer. At the present time water from the west half of this roof drops on private property and becomes a nuisance.
