### Communications.

From the Mayor—

Ann Arbor, Mich., May 24th, 1912.

To the Honorable Common Council: Gentlemen—I am returning to you, without my approval, that part of your proceedings of May 20, 1912, as relates to an increase of salary for our policemen. I do not approve of your resolution for the reason that we have no funds with which to allow this increase. I am in favor of granting to all city employees all the salary they earn, but first we should have the money to do it with.

In the budget for the coming year, you have no funds with which to pay this \$600.00 extra expense. While this amount seems like a small one, yet it would be the beginning of other demands for other increases on the part of other employees, and, if allowed, the firemen who are on duty 21 hours out of every 24, would ask for an increase in salary, and they would be deserving of it, too, if we had the funds, which would mean an additional expense of over \$1,500.00 per year. Our charter limits us in the amount of money we can raise, and, as the city is closely pressed to meet all existing demands, I cannot see how it would be possible at this time to incur additional outlay of money.

I realize that we are not paying our policemen large salaries, but with the condition of our finances and with the amount of money we are allowed to raise by taxation to run our city, the money that we have must be used to the best advantage possible, and I believe that the time has come, in order to keep our expenditures within our receipts, that it will be necessary to cut down expenses rather than increase them.

I wish to take this opportunity to call the attention of the council and the different boards and heads of departments that the budget for the coming year has been made up, which shows the amount each department has to expend, and that the expense of each department should be kept

within such amounts. I do not wish to be understood as being opposed to improvements, but only such improvements should be made as can be made without overdrawing our funds.

I know that there are a great many things which Ann Arbor needs, and which I would like to see made, but I know that there is no use recommending or advocating them because I know we cannot raise the money to do them with, and, until such time when we will have enough funds to make such improvements, we will have to do the best we can with the means at our disposal, even tho it may seem that we are making our policemen or other employees work at a less salary than they are deserving from a city like ours.
