Mayor's Call.

Mr. Ross Granger, City Clerk; You will call a special meeting of the Common Council, to meet at the council chamber, Thursday night, July 24th, 1913, at 7:30 o'clock, for the purpose of considering the advisability of extending the Detroit, Jackson and Chicago Railway switch, now at intersection of Ashley and Huron streets, west about seventy-five feet,

or in some other way make it safe for public travel; to consider plans for renewing switch at Lincoln avenue and Hill streets; and to take such action on the foregoing matters as the council deem best.
