Ann Arbor, Mich., April 17, 1914.

To the Honorable, the Common Council: Gentlemen—The undersigned committee, representing the Ann Arbor Driving Club, respectfully requests that your Honorable body adjust the differences existing between the Park Board and the Ann Arbor Driving Club. The decree of the court, dated June 28th 1910, shows that not

less than \$100.00 shall be expended by the City each year in keeping and maintaining the race track. The Driving Club assure your honorable Body that this has not been done, and we respectfully ask that the amount specified be turned over to the Driving Club each year on July 1st, and allow the Driving Club something for back appropriations not made. The Driving Club has, through an agreement with the President of the Park Board, paid \$5.00 per month for use of small house on the grounds. After going to some expense in repairs on said house, the Driving Club found a tenant who pays a little more to the Club than we pay to the Park Board. Now the Park Board asks that they receive amount paid by tenant.

The Driving Club simply asks that they be treated according to decree of Court and general business principles. We believe the Club is in a position to expend the money provided in the decree for repair and maintaining the driving track to better advantage than the Park Board. We are doing a great deal toward entertaining the people of this city, and are entitled to some consideration.
