2nd. That gutter on the west side of 1st street between Liberty st. and Ann Arbor Railroad be raised under the direction of the Street Commissioner.

3rd. That two inlets be placed on Fourth ave., just north of Packard st

4th. That gutter box be constructed across Forest Court at lowest point and deepen gutter on the north side

from there to Forest ave.
