**From Board of Public Works.**

To the Board of Public Works, Ann Arbor, Mich.: Sirs—Your committee, appointed to inspect the Broadway bridge, respectfully recommends that the Board of Public Works recom-

mend to the Common Council that this bridge be entirely refloored (joists and planking) and that any of the steel work which is buried in the ground be uncovered, inspected and painted. Approximate cost \$1500.00.

Moved by Mr. Reule, that recommendation of the special committee on Broadway bridge be approved. Adopted by Board.

To the Honorable Common Council, Ann Arbor, Michigan: Sirs—After a thorough investigation of the strength of the steel members in the Broadway bridge, I beg to advise that the steel part of this structure is entirely safe for any ordinary load that passes over it. The flooring joists and planking are, however, in quite bad shape, and need attention at once, to be made safe for public travel. I find that three years ago this bridge was re-planked at a cost of more than \$700.00. The cost of the present contemplated repairs will be approximately \$1,500.00. This bridge is not strong enough to support any other type of floor than the wooden one now on it.

Ald. Sink presented an ordinance entitled, An ordinance relative to a sanitary sewer between Chapin street and Seventh street, north of Huron street, and from the north line of Hamilton, Rose & Sheehan Addition to Edwin street.

Whereas, it is proposed to build a sanitary sewer between Chapin street and Seventh street, north of Huron street, in the Third Ward, and also one from the north line of Hamilton, Rose & Sheehan's Addition to Edwin street, in the Seventh ward, and

Whereas, if such sanitary sewers are constructed the city will have to defray the costs of the outlets, and

Whereas, it is part of the original plan for a system of sanitary sewers in the city of Ann Arbor, now, therefore,

The Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor Ordain:

Sec. 1. Whenever the Common Council shall deem it expedient to order the construction of sanitary sewers between Chapin street and Seventh street, north of Huron street, in the Third Ward, and from the north line of Hamilton, Rose & Sheehan's Addition on State street, to Edwin street, in the Seventh ward, and proceedings shall be had as provided in "An ordinance Relative to Sewers, and providing for a system of Lateral and Connecting Sewers in the city of Ann Arbor," the Common Council may appropriate for the construction of said sanitary sewers such of the costs thereof as the Common Council shall deem it just for the city to pay for outlets to said sewers, in addition to the cost of the street crossings, and may make such appropriation by suitable resolution.

Sec. 2. The proceedings relative to the construction of such sanitary sewers shall be in accordance with an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance Relative to Sewers, Providing for the Construction of a System of Lateral and Connecting Sewers in the city of

Ann Arbor," passed May 21st, 1894, approved May 23rd, 1894; amended January 3rd, 1899; amended August 17th, 1903; amended March 12th, 1906; amended March 18th, 1907, in all respects except as otherwise expressed and provided.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on and after legal publication.

The foregoing ordinance was given its second reading and passed to and given its third reading by unanimous vote of those present, 14.

The chair put the question, "Shall this ordinance pass?")

Passed by following vote: Yeas, Ald. Heusel, Fiegel, Hanselmann, A. Lutz, Koernke, Heck, Markey, Sherk, Manwaring, McGregor, Freeman, G. Lutz, Sink, Pres. Wurster, 14. Nays, none.

Ald. Sink presented an ordinance to amend an ordinance entitled, "An ordinance to regulate and control the driving of automobiles, motor vehicles and other vehicles within the City of Ann Arbor," which was given its first reading by title, passed to and given its second reading and referred to the ordinance committee by following vote: Yeas, Ald. Heusel, Fiegel, Hanselmann, A. Lutz, Koernke, Heck, Markey, Sherk, Manwaring, McGregor, Freeman, G. Lutz, Sink, Pres. Wurster, 14. Nays, none.

Ald. Sink presented an ordinance entitled, An ordinance to regulate the soliciting of funds for charitable purposes within the City of Ann Arbor, which was given its first reading by title and referred to the ordinance committee by unanimous vote of those present, 14.

**Street Committee.**

To the Council: Gentlemen—Your street committee have had the following matters under consideration and recommend: That the gutters on Jackson avenue be set back and graded on each side of street car track, and roadway graveled from pavement to city limits; Dexter avenue be graveled where needed; Fourth avenue graveled from Liberty to Packard streets; and West street graveled from Seventh street to city limits, under the direction of the Street commissioner. That Norway road, from Ferdon road to Austin avenue, and Fair Oaks Parkway, from Washtenaw avenue to L. D. Carr property, be graveled, the city and Mr. Spooner to furnish an equal number of teams

to haul gravel, and Mr. Spooner to also furnish man to spread and roll the gravel.

We further recommend, that two inlets be placed at low points on White street, between Arch and McKinley, and gutters graded to carry water to inlets; that trees be removed from center of Hiscock street, between Summit and First streets, and one standing in front of 829 South Main street, and that the Board of Park Commissioners be requested to trim tree on lawn extension front of same number, as soon as is possible.

We also recommend that this Council as a committee of the whole investigate the condition of Edward street, running north from Summit street, at once.

Albert Fiegel, Chairman of Street Committee.

Ald. Fiegel moved the adoption of the report, which was adopted by unanimous vote of those present, 14.

Exit Ald. Fiegel.

#### Sewer Committee.

To the Council: Gentlemen—Your committee on sewers, to whom was referred the reports of the Engineer relative to the construction of lateral sewers in sewer districts No. 68, Seventh, Bath and Willow streets; No. 69, Moseley street from Second to Third streets; No. 70, West street from Main street west; No. 71, Roosevelt avenue from Church street to Forest avenue; and No. 72, Granger avenue, streets in the Hamilton, Rose & Sheehan Addition and State street, begs leave to report that we have had such estimates and reports as well as the resolution of the Council under consideration, and have made due inquires relating thereto, and have heard all persons desiring to be heard in the premises, and your committee is of the opinion that there is necessity for the construction of such lateral sewers, and that special taxing or assessment districts ought to be fixed by the Common Council upon and against which the construction of such sewers may be charged, street crossings and such other part excepted, pursuant to the ordinance in such case made and provided. Your committee further recommends that resolutions fixing the boundaries of said districts be prepared by the City Engineer and the Board of Public Works be ordered to advertise for bids for the construction of above named sewers.

I. L. Sherk, Sam. Heusel, Thos. Hanselmann, Sewer Committee.

Ald. Sherk moved the adoption of the report, which was adopted by unanimous vote of those present, 13.

By Ald. Sherk: Resolved, that the Common Council still deeming it a necessary public improvement, and expedient to be constructed lateral sewers in lateral sewer districts No. 68, Seventh, Bath and Willow streets; No. 69, Mosely street from Second to Third streets; No. 70, West street from Main street west; No. 71, Roosevelt avenue from Church street to Forest avenue; No. 72, Granger ave. and streets in the Hamilton, Rose & Sheehan Addition and State street, and the construction of the same is hereby ordered.

Resolved, further, that the City Engineer furnish proper boundaries as soon as possible and that this order and determination be certified to the Board of Public Works and the City Assessor, and the Board of Public Works advertise for bids for the construction of said sewers according to the ordinance governing the same. City to furnish man to see that sewer pipe is properly laid.

Adopted by unanimous vote of those present, 13.

#### Sidewalk Committee.

To the Council: Gentlemen—Your committee have had the following matters under consideration and recommend that new sidewalks be constructed as follows: On Olivia ave., both sides, from Minerva road to walks to be built by the city; on the south side of West Washington street, from 9th street to Crest ave.; on the east side of Crest ave., in front of properties of Oscar Kremrei, Charles Brooks and R. T. Dobson; on west side of Sybil street, between Benjamin and Edwin streets; on the west side of Thompson street, between Madison and Packard streets; on south side of Monroe street, in front of numbers 714 and 718; on the west side of White street, from McKinley ave. to the south end of White street, five feet in width, and a twelve and one-half foot sidewalk in front of number 310 South State street.

We further recommend that the sidewalk extension at the northwest corner of Fourth ave. and William street be raised and repaired; that sidewalks along numbers 837, 841, 848 East University ave., and along property at corner of East University

and Oakland aves., be repaired, and crosswalks be constructed at intersections of East University and Oakland aves., and East University and Tappan street.

We also recommend that three-inch iron railings be placed as follows: 20 feet on the south side and 28 feet on the north side of Felch street culvert, and 28 feet on each side of the Seventh street culvert.

We further recommend that all sidewalk extensions along new pavements on Jefferson and Division streets be repaired to conform with present grade.

Sam Heusel, Julius H. Koernke, I. J. Sherk, Chas. A. Sunk, Sidewalk Committee.

Ald. Koernke moved the adoption of the report, which was adopted by unanimous vote of those present, 13.

By Ald. Koernke: Resolved, That the grading and construction of the sidewalks hereinafter mentioned is deemed and declared to be a necessary, public improvement.

Therefore, It is hereby ordered that stone or cement sidewalks be graded, built and constructed in the City of Ann Arbor, on and along the south side of West Washington street, between 9th street and Crest ave.

On east side of Crest ave., in front of properties of Oscar Kremrei, Charles Brooks and R. T. Dobson.

On west side of Sybil street, between Benjamin and Edwin streets.

On the west side of Thompson street, between Madison and Packard streets.

On the south side of Monroe street, in front of numbers 714 and 718.

On the west side of White street, from McKinley ave. to south end of White street.

On both sides of Olivia ave., from Minerva road south to the walks to be constructed by the city. Five feet in width.

On west side of South State street, along number 310, 12 1-2 feet in width.

Adopted by unanimous vote of those present, 13.

Moved by Ald. Heusel, That matter of sidewalk grade on west side of Pontiac street be referred to the Sidewalk Committee and City Engineer. Adopted.

**Railway Committee.**

To the Honorable, the Common Council: Gentlemen—The petition, relative to the smoke from the Var-

sity Laundry, having been referred to this committee, we have to report:

That this matter has been before the Council at least twice before; once when Mr. Kearney was City Attorney, and once when Mr. Stivers held that office, and the Council were advised by both of those gentlemen that under the law as it existed, the Council had no power to abate the alleged nuisance, but that if the smoke were really a nuisance that any citizen aggrieved could proceed by injunction and have it abated.

As we have had no legal advice contrary to that above mentioned, we have to report that the Council can take no action in the matter.

We suggest, however, that our present City Attorney be asked for an opinion on the subject.

E. B. Manwaring, C. C. Freeman, Railway Committee.

Ald. Manwaring moved the adoption of the report, which was adopted by unanimous vote of those present, 13.

**Lighting Committee.**

By Ald. G. Lutz: Resolved, That the City Clerk be and he is hereby ordered to advertise for proposals on lighting the streets and alleys of the City, for a period of five years from and after the 31st day of December, 1915. Bids to be in the Clerk's office on or before 5 o'clock p. m., Monday, October 4th, 1915.

Adopted by unanimous vote of those present, 13.

**Bond Committee.**

To the Council: Gentlemen—Your bond committee has had the plumber's bond of The Economy Plumbing Shop, with Arthur H. Hull and George Washington as principals, and John C. Fischer and John Wilkinson, sureties, under consideration and recommend approval of same.

Ald. Heck moved the adoption of the report, which was adopted by unanimous vote of those present, 13.
