Ordinance Committee.

Ald. Sink presented an ordinance for its third reading as follows:

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING AN OFFICIAL DATUM FOR ALL LEVELS IN THE CITY OF ANN ARBOR.

The Common Council of the city of Ann Arbor ordain:

Section 1. That for the purpose of making and taking all levels for the establishment of grades of streets, roads, highways lanes, alleys, sidewalks, curbs, crosswalks, pavements, sewers, and all other grades in the city of Ann Arbor, an official City Datum for the city of Ann Arbor is hereby established as the United States Geological Survey elevation of mean sea level. This is 3.39 feet above the general City Datum which was adopted Nov. 5, 1888, and is now in use in Ann Arbor.

That the following are determined and established elevations above the datum, above designated as the United States Geological Surveys elevation of mean sea level, of the following named places in the city of Ann Arbor:

874.976 U. S. G. S. Bench mark under trap door on south end of Engineering Building shops on campus at University of Michigan.

842.800 U. S. G. S. Bench mark on plate about four feet above ground on south side of Court House near east end.

792.990. Bench mark on the northeast corner of the southeast concrete column-foundation at A. A. R. R. viaduct over Miller avenue.

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after legal publication.

The Chair put the question, "Shall this ordinance pass?"
