The Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor ordain:

Section 1. That an ordinance entitled, "An ordinance relative to porters, runners and drivers, and to regulate hacks and drays," passed March 16, 1896; approved March 17, 1896; amended Aug. 20, 1900; amended Nov. 15th, 1915, be and the same is hereby amended by the addition of a section to be known as section 2a, said section to read as follows:

Section 2a. Each driver of a vehicle used for the conveyance of household goods or household furniture in any part of the city, or into or out of the city, except for a retail store, shall keep a record of the place from and the place to which he moves the household furnishings or household goods of any person, and the person for whom the goods were moved; and on Monday of each week, except when Monday is a legal holiday, and then on the next succeeding secular day, shall file with the chief of police, a detailed statement containing every such transaction of the previous week. Such statements shall be made upon blanks furnished free of charge upon application to the city clerk.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on and after ten days from legal publication.

The Chair put the question, "Shall this ordinance pass?"

Engineer's Estimate.

Converting Allen's Creek Into Storm Sewer.

Ann Arbor, Michigan, August 6, 1917.

To the Honorable Common Council, Ann Arbor, Michigan: Sirs—I present the following estimate of cost of improving Allen's Creek by converting it into a closed main storm sewer. The general plans showing the proposed location, grade and sizes are on file in my office. The specifications to govern are the standard specifications for sewer construction in the city of Ann Arbor:

Inasmuch as the prices for work of this kind are at an abnormally high level and there is no certainty of the improvement being built under these conditions, some of the smaller details of this sewer have not been completed, it being considered that these details, together with a revised estimate of the cost, should be worked out immediately prior to the building of the whole or any section of this improvement and taking into account conditions existing at that time.

I have investigated, to some extent, the question of right of way for this sewer and believe that in all except perhaps two or three cases, the right of way for this improvement will be donated by the people or corporation across whose land it must be constructed for the benefit that it will be to the property.

This problem in general has been very carefully studied and worked out as to the larger details of areas tributary and sizes needed.

The converting of this open creek into a covered storm sewer is one of the most important improvements now facing the city of Ann Arbor. The construction of this improvement should be started at as early a date as possible and if it is not deemed

advisable to construct it in its entirety during any one year of short period of time, amounts of money sufficient to build it section by section should be appropriated each year and the work carried on in this way as rapidly as possible until it is completed.
