Ann Arbor, Mich., Sept. 4, 1917.

ern time and it is necessary at this time to know on account of announcements and schedules which are now being sent out. I am also convinced that should you now again change to central time, you would have much difficulty in again adopting the eastern time.

From Board of Public Works.

City Engineer presented tabulation of bids received August 17, 1917, on ten ton road roller with scarifier, f. o. b. Ann Arbor, as follows:

Buffalo Springfield Roller Co., Kelly Springfield two cylinder motor \$3,950.00; double cylinder steam locomotive type boiler, \$3,850.00; double cylinder steam, Pitts boiler locomotive style \$3,850.00; allowance for old roller, \$300.00.

Austin-Western Road Machinery Co., Austin motor single cylinder \$3,750.00; double cylinder \$4,300.00; allowance for old roller, \$750.00.

Good Roads Machinery Co., two cylinder steam \$3,450.00; allowance for old roller, \$500.00.

Huber Mfg. Co., two cylinder steam \$2,775.00; single cylinder steam, \$2,625.00; allowance for old roller, \$400.00.

Barber Asphalt Paving Co., double cylinder steam \$3,819.00; allowance for old roller, \$150.00.
