Every hawker, peddler Section 7. or person going about from place to place or who makes use of any of the streets or open places in said city. celling or offering for sale goods. wares, merchandise or any species of property, shall pay a license in the sum of one hundred dol'ars (\$100.00) per year, or fifty dollars (\$50.00) for And for a period less six months. than six months, such person shall pay a license therefor as follows: That is to say, if he intends to travel on foot, \$3.00; if he intends to travel with one horse or more. \$5.00 for ev ry vehicle used. Any person selling or offering for sale any property from any wagon, hand-cart, showcase, window or stand in any street or open p'ace shall sum of pay the and \$10.00 per day; in granting licenses for any such purpose, in any street or open place, the Mayor may disignate where any such wagon, hand-cart, stand or show case shall be located, and shall have the power to change and relocate the same from time to time at his discretion; provided, that any resident of the city of Ann Arbor, having a bona fida resid nce in said city for a period of at least six months prior to the time of making application for a license, may obtain a license by the payment of \$25.00 for a six months period, for the purpose of selling, and peddling, dairy,

Provided, further, this sction shall not apply to tion of the persons selling meat, domestic frust, by the foldairy, farm or garden produce (of len, Mayer, their own raising and production), Markey, nor to bakers or merchants delivering tan, Lutz, goods to their customers.

Section 2. All ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistant herewith

are hereby reptaled.

Section 3. This ordinance is to take effect and be in force on and after ten days from legal publication.
