The Assessor shall receive \$1500.00 per annum: the Justices of the Peace and the Constables shall be allowed the same fees as are by law allowed to corresponding township officers: members of the Common Council shall serve without pay, excepting for services on boards of review, election boards and boards of registration, for which services they shall receive payment of five dollars per day; Supervisors and all other officers of said city shall be entitled to receive such compensation as the Common Council shall allow, not exceeding \$4.00 per day for every day actually employed in the performance of the duties of their respective offices. Provided, that the Common Council may increase the compensation of any officer whenever authorized by a majority vote of the qualified electors of the said city, voting at any charter election, ten days notice having been given of the proposed increase.
