Ordinance Committee.

Ald. Reichert presented the following ordinance which was given its third reading:

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED, "AN ORDINANCE RELATIVE TO THE MANAGEMENT AND CONTROL OF FAIR VIEW CEMETERY PASSED JANUARY 9th, 1905; APPROVED JANUARY 17th, 1905; AMENDED MAY 19th, 1913.

The Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor ordain:

1. That Section four of an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance relative to the Management and Control of Fair View Cemetery, passed January 9, 1905; approved January 17th, 1905 and amended May 19th, 1913, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 4. All persons desiring to bury relatives or friends in Fair View Cemetery must file an application with the City Clerk for a burial permit, such application to be accompanied by the necessary fee, as shall be from time to time established by resolution of the Common Council. For the use of the receiving vault in said Cemetery the person making the application for using the same shall pay to the City Clerk such sum or sums as shall be from time to time established by resolution of the Common Council. Provided, however, that if a body is placed in the receiving vault for the convenience of the sexton no charge for such time shall be made.

2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after legal publication.

That all persons desiring to bury relatives or friends in Fairview cemetery must file an application at the office of the city clerk for a burial permit, such application to be accompanied by a fee of seven dollars for an adult or child over twelve years of age; five dollars for a child from the age of five years to twelve years; and three dollars for a child under five years of age, provided, that when a large steel or cement vault is used the fee for same shall be ten dollars. Fee for burial permit shall cover the expense of digging, filling and sodding the grave.

2. That the following charges shall be paid at the office of the city clerk for use of the receiving vault: Two dollars for first fifteen days and twenty-five cents per week thereafter for all persons over twelve years of age, and one dollar for first fifteen days and twenty-five cents per week thereafter for all persons not over twelve years of age; provided, that if burial is made in Fairview cemetery there shall be no charge for use of receiving vault.
