Sewer Committee Report.

To the Honorable, the Common Council: Gentlemen—Your Sewer committee, to whom was referred the estimate and report of the City Engineer, relative to the construction of lateral sewer in sewer district No. 97, on Day street from Cambridge Road to Wayne street, begs leave to report that we have had such estimate and report, as well as resolution of Council, under consideration and have made due inquiries relating thereto and

have heard all persons desiring to be heard in the premises, and your committee is of the opinion that there is necessity for the construction of such lateral sewer in said district, and that special taxing or assessment district ought to be fixed by the Common Council upon and against which the construction of such sewer may be charged, street intersections excepted, pursuant to the ordinance in such case made and provided.

Your committee further recommends that resolutions fixing the boundary of said district be prepared by the City Engineer, and the Board of Public Works ordered to advertise for bids for the construction of above named sewer.

Your committee further recommends that the Acting Marshal be instructed to prevent any more rubbish being left at the dumping ground near Wall street bridge and that the Health Officer secure suitable dumping ground.

fice hours from Sept. 1, 1920, to October 15, 1920, inclusive.

Resolved, further, that registration be held at the usual ward polling places on Saturday, October 16, 1920, from 8 o'clock a. m. to 8 o'clock p. m., central standard time, and the Supervisors and Aldermen of each ward shall constitute the board of registration therein.

Resolved, further, that the City Clerk be and he is hereby authorized to appoint such assistants as may be necessary for registration and re-registration and to properly comply with absent voters' law, such assistants to receive four dollars per day.
