To the Honorable, the Common Council,

City of Ann Arbor,

Gentlemen:

I wish to submit to you some of the facts pertaining to the operation of our Police Department.

Some years ago, your Honorable Body passed a resolution limiting the number of the police force to fourteen. At the present time, we are operating with that number and I believe we will not need to increase that number until next spring, when the traffic officers are put out on the streets again, then it will probably be necessary to add one more patrolman. For the

past few years, the Acting Chief of Police has been looking after the Chief of Police and Sergeants duties and as a result, he has had to spend too much time looking after details and not as much time looking after the operation of the Department as he should.

I am trying to overcome this difficulty by giving him the proper help in the office and I believe this can be accomplished during the winter months but in the spring, we will need the extra man as mentioned above. Therefore, I recommend that your Honorable Body consider the advisability of increasing this number from fourteen to eighteen, not with the idea of appointing more men at the present time but to be in a position so that we can appoint more men if necessary without waiting the necessary council action.

To the Honorable, the Common Council, City of Ann Arbor,

Gentlemen:

According to our Charter, the Police Department is entirely under the Mayor. As a result of this, the Police Department can very easily be used for political purposes if a Mayor so desires. Everytime there is a change in the office of Mayor, the men on your Police Department are rather uneasy in not knowing whether they are going to maintain their job or not. This arrangement leads to very poor efficiency on the part of the police force.

I realize that we do not wish to form any more Boards or Commissions, therefore, I recommend that your Honorable body consider the advisability of placing the Police Department and the Fire Department under the same commission.

I would like to call your attention to the traffic conditions on Huron and Liberty streets.

These streets are only thirty feet wide from curb to curb. The conditions on Huron street are worse than on Liberty st. due to certain business places on that street and as a result, a greater amount of parking there than on the other.

However, I would recommend that the matter of widening Huron Street and possibly Liberty be investigated and if possible, enough money put in the budget for next year to do at least part of this work.
