Communications

From Mayor.

July 2, 1923.

To the Honorable Common Council, City of Ann Arbor, Mich.

Gentlemen—When the construction of our sanitary sewers is completed this year, the amount of money we are allowed to raise by bonds according to our charter will be used up. After this year we will only have \$20,000 per year for this work unless this bond limit is raised. I would suggest that your honorable body submit to the voters at the next election an amendment to the charter to raise this bond limit from \$80,000 to \$200,000.

Due to the gradual increase in the size of our city, the main sanitary sewers being worked to its limit. It will soon be necessary to build the main relief sewer as was proposed in the recent sewer survey. I therefore suggest that your honorable body begin to make a study of the best way to finance this work.

In looking over our pavements I find that we will soon have to repave certain streets. The way to finance this repaving should be given some careful study by this Council.

I also find that we will reach the limit which we are allowed to bond our city for pavements this year, as provided in our charter. In order to pave the streets that should be paved it will be necessary to raise this bond limit. I therefore suggest that you submit to the voters at the next election an amendment to the charter to raise this bond limit from \$300,000 to \$500,000.
