has been applied to in writing by a majority of the owners of the lands, which are liable to be assessed for the payment of the construction of the same, praying for the grading and paving of Oak Lane between Austin avenue and Fair Oaks Parkway within the corporate limits of the City of Ann Arbor, Michigan, and

Whereas, the grading and paving of that part of Oak Lane street within the limits aforesaid, is deemed and declared to be a necessary public improvement; therefore be it

Resolved, that it is hereby declared to be the purpose of the Common Council to cause said Oak Lane street within the limits aforesaid, to be graded and paved under the Charter and Ordinance of the City of Ann Arbor, and in pursuance of the prayer of said petitioners.

Resolved, further, that the cost and expense of the construction of such public improvement shall be charged, assessed and paid as follows:

All street and public alley intersections, and 20 per cent of the remaining shall be paid by the city, and the remainder shall be assessed and paid by special assessment levied and assessed, according to benefits on and against all the lands, tenements and premises lying on or fronting said Oak Lane Street within the limits aforesaid.
