Observatory St. Pavement Resolution

Whereas this Common Council has been applied to in writing by a majority of the owners of the lands which are liable to be assessed for the payment of the construction of the same, praying for the grading and paving of Observatory street, between Geddes avenue and Ann street, within corporate limits of the City of Ann Arbor, Michigan, and

Whereas the grading and paving of that part of Observatory street, within the limits aforesaid, is deemed and declared to be a necessary public improvement; therefore, be it

Resolved, that it is hereby declared to be the purpose of the Common Council to cause said Observatory street, within the limits aforesaid, to be graded and paved under the Charter and Ordinance of the City of Ann Arbor, and in pursuance of the prayer of said petitioners.

Resolved, further, that the cost and expense of the construction of such public improvement shall be charged, assessed and paid as follows:

All street and public alley intersections and 20 per cent of the remaining shall be paid by the city, and the remainder shall be assessed and paid by special assessment levied and assessed, according to benefits on and against all the lands, tenements and premises lying on or fronting said Observatory street, within the limits aforesaid.

Arbor St. Curb & Gutter Resolution

Whereas, the curbing and guttering of that part of Arbor street, within the limits aforesaid, is deemed and declared to be a necessary public improvement; therefore be it

Resolved, that it is hereby declared to be the purpose of the Common Council to cause Arbor street, within the limits aforesaid, to be curbed and guttered under the charter and ordinances of the City of Ann Arbor, and in pursuance of the prayer of said petitioners.

Resolved, further, that the cost and expense of the construction of such public improvement shall be charged, assessed and paid as follows: All street and public alley intersections and fifty per cent of the remaining shall be paid by the city, and the remainder shall be assessed and paid by special as-

assessment levied and assessed according to benefits on and against all the lands, tenements and premises lying on or fronting Arbor street, within the limits aforesaid.

Resolved, further, that the said petition along with this determination, be and the same is hereby referred to the Board of Public Works with directions to report to the council with all convenient dispatch suitable plans with specifications for the said proposed improvement, the kind and quality of material to be used therefor, together with an estimate of the probable cost and expense of such public improvement.

To the Honorable the Common Council.
Gentlemen:

Your Sidewalk Committee respectfully recommends that the following sidewalks be ordered built and the following resolution adopted:

Resolved, That the grading and construction of the sidewalks hereinafter mentioned is deemed and declared to be a necessary public improvement.

Therefore, It is hereby ordered that Portland cement concrete sidewalks be graded, built and constructed in the City of Ann Arbor on and along the following property; width of walk to be five feet unless otherwise stated.
