Sidewalk Committee Report.

To the Honorable, the Common Council.

Gentlemen:

Your Sidewalk Committee respectfully recommends that the following sidewalks be ordered built and the following resolution adopted:

Resolved, That the grading and construction of sidewalks herein-after mentioned is deemed and declared to be necessary public improvements.

Therefore, It is hereby ordered that Portland Cement concrete sidewalks be graded, built and constructed in the City of Ann Arbor on and along the following property; width of walk to be five feet unless otherwise stated:

North State Street—

East side, new walks at Nos. 204 and 406;

Repairs, No. 200, 4 or more blocks; at property line between Nos. 210 and 216, level up or down;

at No. 418 new driveway and four new blocks.

Lots 1 and 8, B 2 N, R 10 E, Eastern Add.

Lot 3 and the W 5 rods of lot 1, B 4 N, R 10 E, Eastern Add.

South State Street—

West side, at Groves block.

Repair four to eight blocks.

Lot 13, Assessor's Plat No. 10, part of the NE 1-4, Sec. 29, Ann Arbor, being lot 5, B 2 S, R 9 E.

Twelfth Street—

West side, No. 220.

Walk is low and water stands on it, either a new walk or lawn extension to be lowered. If a new walk, city should bear the expense.

No. 226, repair 2 or 3 blocks.

Lots 12 and 13, B 2 S, R 12 E, Eastern Add.

North Fourth Avenue—

Nos. 207, 209, 211, on West side and

Nos. 208, 212, inc. on East side. All extended to curb.

On East side, the S 22 ft. of lot 3 and the N 48 ft. of lot 2, B 2 N, R 5 E.

On West side, the N 55 ft of lot 1, B 2 N, R 4 E.

South Thayer Street—

West side, Nos. 224, 228 and driveway and 2 blocks at No. 220.

Lots 12 and 13, B 2 S, R 10 E, Eastern Add.

West Ann Street—

South side, North of Jail property.

Repair one block on north side of Whitney Theater.

Lot 6 and 7, B 1 N, R 3 E.

West Huron Street—

North side, repair holes in outer sections in front of 3 western fronts of Savings Bank Blk.

The S 1-2 of lots 1 and 2, B 1 N, R 3 E.

Murray Avenue—

West side, from Liberty st. northward to No. 232 and No. 216 and northward to Washington st.

East side, from Washington st. southward to No. 209; also Nos. 239 and 245 and southward to Liberty st.

On West side, lots 31, 34, 35, 36, the S 22ft of lot 37, lot 44, 45, 46 and the N 31 ft. of lot 43, B 3 Assessor's Plat No. 3.

On East side, lots 16, 26, 28 and 29, B 3, Assessor's Plat No. 3.

West Liberty Street—

North side, Nos. 612 and 610.

Lots 29 and 30, B 3, Assessor's Plat No. 3.

Pine Ridge—

West side, from No. 211 southward to Dexter Ave.

Lot 3 and 22, Pine Ridge.

North First Street—

West side, from Ann st. to Miller Ave.

A parcel of land part of B 2 N, R 1 E, beginning at the intersection of the W line of First st. and the N line of Ann st.; thence W along N line of Ann st. 90 ft; thence N parallel to First st. 181 ft., E 24 ft.; thence N to S line of Miller Ave., E to W line of First.; thence S to beginning.

Miller Avenue—

South side, from corner of First st. to No. 313, also from Allen's Creek to A. A. R. R., also from west line of A. A. R. R. to Chapin st., also No. 829.

A parcel of land part of B 2 N, R 1 E, beginning at the intersection of the W line of First st. with the S line of Miller ave.; thence S along W line of First st 24 1-2 ft W parallel to Miller ave. 66 ft., S 25 ft.; thence W and NWly parallel to Miller ave. to A. A. R. R. right of way; thence Nly along said right of way to Miller ave.; thence SEly and E along Sly line of Miller ave. to beginning.

North side from Prospect st. west for one lot.

Lot 34, Miller Add.

Packard Street—

NE side, No. 1121 both Packard and Wells street sides; also from No. 1207 Northwesterly to Wells st.

The SWly 81 1-2 ft of lot 69, Miller Add.

Lots 64 and 65, Eberbach Add.

Mack Road—

From No. 512 to Elm st. 4 ft. wide.

Lot 5, 14 and the Ely 9 1-2 ft. of lot 4, Chas. A. Ward Sub.

Lot 8, Carpenter Sub.

Elm Street—

West side from Mack Road southward to South University ave. 4 ft. wide; also Nos. 522, 524, 528, and from Wilmot st. to Geddes ave. 4 ft. wide.

East side, No. 507 and repair 2 blocks at 517 and 1 at 525.

Park & Sanitary Committee.

By Ald. Hammial:

Resolved, that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to sign and execute a warrant to John Lee and Alice Lee, husband and wife, in the sum of \$2,500.00 for the east half of the following described property:

All that part of the southeast one-quarter of section twenty-one, township two south, range six east of Meridian of Michigan, bounded and described as follows, to wit: beginning on the south line of said section, thirty-nine rods east of the south one-quarter post of said section; thence east four rods; thence north at right angles with the south line of said section, ten rods; thence west parallel to the said section line four rods; thence south ten rods to the place of beginning. Subject to the highway.

Upon delivery to the City of Ann Arbor of a warranty deed thereto and option to the said City to purchase the west half of the foregoing described property for the sum of \$2,500, which said option shall run to August 1, 1927, and that the said City shall have the right to take up said option and get warranty deed to the said west half of the foregoing described property upon ten days' notice of its desire to take up said option.

The said John Lee and Alice Lee shall have the right to occupy the house on said premises until such time as the City exercises its right under the option, without cost to themselves, until August 1st, 1927.
