Street Committee Order of Assessments

By Ald. Maulbetsch:

Resolved, that this Common Council requires and orders the sum of \$3,020.60 for Pavement District No. 75, all payable in ten equal annual installments with 5 percent interest, or at the option of the tax payers in one payment, to be raised by tax and a special assessment on and against the lots, parts of lots, lands, tenements and premises in said pavement district and situated in the special assessment district as a tax against the owners thereof; all to be assessed on and against said lands, tenements and premises according to the benefits coming to each parcel thereof from such local public improvement, and the City Assessor is hereby required to levy and assess the said sum of money as aforesaid on and against the lands, tenements and premises of said pavement district, the boundary for which was adopted by the Common Council December 6, 1926, and on and upon the special assessment rolls for said pavement district, and on and upon each and every of the regular assessment rolls of the City of Ann Arbor for the year and during which any such special assessment may be

payable until the whole of such special assessment shall be paid in full, all to be assessed in the manner and for the purpose aforesaid pursuant to law.

Resolved, further, that the sum of \$5,680.52 is hereby appropriated for the purpose of defraying the cost of such public improvement at street and alley intersections, a portion thirteen feet in width and 20 per cent of the balance of cost of said public improvement, except that portion constructed by the State Highway Department; all of which sum of money, in ten equal annual installments with interest is hereby ordered and required to be levied, spread and assessed on and upon each and every of the regular annual assessment rolls of the City of Ann Arbor, and on and against all the taxable property within the said City and during the period in which any part of this appropriation and assessment is or shall be payable.

Resolved, further, that the City Clerk do certify this determination and order of assessments to the City Assessor pursuant to law.

Railway Committee

Resolution Ordering Lateral Sewer Bonds

By Ald Lutz:

Whereas, this Common Council has authorized the construction by the Board of Public Works of lateral sewers in lateral sewer districts Nos. 169 and 170, and caused to be certified to the City Assessor the lands, tenements and premises to be assessed for the cost of said public improvements and the amounts required to be levied, spread and assessed on and upon each and every of the regular annual assessment rolls of the City of Ann Arbor, therefore be it

Resolved, and it is hereby ordered, that the Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized and required to sign and countersign respectively and execute, under their hands and the seal of the City of

Ann Arbor, lateral sewer bonds of said city under date of January 5, 1927, as follows, to-wit: For district No. 169, the sum of fourteen hundred ninety-two dollars; for district No. 170, the sum of twenty-nine hundred thirty-six dollars; that being less than the cost of said public improvements, said bonds payable to bearer in four equal annual installments beginning August 1, 1927, with interest at four and one-half per cent per annum, payable annually on the first day of August in each and every year, as evidenced by interest coupons to be thereto attached.

Resolved, further, that said Mayor and City Clerk be and they are hereby authorized and directed to deliver said bonds, when executed, to the City Treasurer, who is authorized to sell said bonds at not less than par and accrued interest; and said bonds and coupons shall be substantially in the form for lateral sewer bonds and coupons adopted by this Common Council August 2, 1926.

Resolved, further, that the estimated period of usefulness of said lateral sewers is hereby determined to be fifteen years and upwards.
