Whereas, this Common Council has been applied to in writing by a majority of the owners of the lands, which are liable to be assessed for the payment of the construction of the same, praying for the curbing and guttering of the following curb and gutter districts:

District No. 135, extension of Forest Ave. between Washtenaw Ave. and Geddes Ave; District No. 136, on Awixa Road, Lenawee Drive, Highland Road and Lafayette Road; District No. 137, on Doty Ave. between Dexter Ave. and the north end of Doty Ave.; District No. 138, on Brockman Blvd.,



between Washtenaw Ave. and Copley Ave.; District No. 139, on N. First St. between Miller Ave. and Kingsley St.; District No. 140 on Baldwin Ave. between Wells St. and Granger Ave.; District No. 141, on the east side of Fourteenth St. between Volland St. and Huron St.; within the corporate limits of the City of Ann Arbor, Michigan; and

Whereas, the curbing and guttering of the above named districts, within the limits aforesaid, is deemed and declared to be necessary public improvements; therefore be it

Resolved, further, that the said petitions along with this determination be and the same are hereby referred to the Board of Public Works with directions to report to the Common Council, with convenient dispatch, suitable plans with specifications for the proposed improvements, the kind and quality of material to be used therefore, together with an estimate of the probable cost and expense of such public improvements.
