Legal Opinion on Bonds

Mr. Isaac G. Reynolds, City Clerk,
Ann Arbor, Michigan.

Dear Sir: We have examined transcript of proceedings for the issue by the City of Ann Arbor, Washtenaw County, Michigan, of bonds in the aggregate principal sum of \$28,000 for the purpose of constructing the Fuller Street bridge in said city, said issue consisting of twenty-eight bonds of \$1,000 each, number 1 to 28, inclusive, dated August 1, 1927 and payable, \$4,000 on August 1 of each year from 1928 to 1934, inclusive, with interest not to exceed 4 1-2 per cent payable annually on August 1 of each year.

From such examination we are of opinion that said bonds, when sold, executed and delivered in the form proposed, will be a valid and binding obligation of the City of Ann Arbor and that all taxable property in said city will be sub-

ject to taxation for their payment.
