### Legal Opinion on Pavement Bonds July 29, 1927

Mr. Isaac G. Reynolds,

Ann Arbor, Michigan.

Dear Sir:

We have examined transcript of proceedings for the issue by the City of Ann Arbor, Washtenaw County, Michigan, of bonds in the aggregate principal sum of \$175,000 in anticipation of the collection of taxes and assessments for paving streets, as follows:

District No. 72, Ingalls and Kingsley Streets, \$35,000, being 30 bonds of \$1,000 each and 10 bonds of \$500 each, numbered 1 to 40, inclusive.

District No. 74, North Main Street, \$20,000, being 20 bonds of \$1,000 each, numbered 1 to 20, inclusive.

District No. 76, Dexter Avenue, \$40,000, being 40 bonds of \$1,000 each, numbered 1 to 40, inclusive.

District No. 79, South Seventh Street, \$15,000, being 10 bonds of \$1,000 each, and 10 bonds of \$500 each, numbered 1 to 20, inclusive.

District No. 80, North Seventh Street, \$15,000, being 10 bonds of \$1,000 each and 10 bonds of \$500 each, numbered 1 to 20, inclusive.

District No. 81, Spring Street, \$15,000, being 10 bonds of \$1,000 each and 10 bonds of \$500 each, numbered 1 to 20, inclusive.

District No. 89, Ferdon Road, \$15,000, being 10 bonds of \$1,000 each and 10 bonds of \$500 each, numbered 1 to 20, inclusive.

District No. 90, Granger Avenue, \$20,000, being 20 bonds of \$1,000 each, number 1 to 20, inclusive.

All of said bonds being dated August 1, 1927, and bearing interest not to exceed 4 1-2 per cent, payable annually on August 1 of each year.

From such examination we are of opinion that said bonds when sold, executed and delivered in the form proposed will be a valid and binding obligation of the City of Ann Arbor and that all taxable property in said city will be subject to taxation for their payment.

That Section 13 of an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance Relative to the Licensing of Dogs, and Preventing and Regulating the Running at Large; and the Slaying of Dogs," passed August 7, 1911; approved August 17, 1911; amended May 5, 1913, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 13. It shall be unlawful for any person owning, possessing or harboring any dog to suffer or permit the same to run at large at any time in any street, alley, square, commons, park or other public place in the city of Ann Arbor without having first obtained a license therefor, as provided in this ordinance and without first having a certificate from a registered veterinarian, certifying that the dog has been inoculated against rabies in accordance with methods approved by the Board of Health of the city of Ann Arbor. Said certificate shall be in such form as shall be prescribed by the Board of Health of the city and shall be presented, upon demand, to any official or officer of the Police or Health Departments, or Pound Master of said city. Failure to comply with the provisions hereof will subject the offender or offenders to the penalty or penalties as in this ordinance provided.

Section 2.—Any ordinance or parts of ordinance inconsistent with any of the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after ten days from legal publication thereof.
