Gentlemen:

At the request of Mr. Emory of the University of Michigan Office of the Dean of Men, we submit herewith a proposed tripper service schedule for operation in the City of Ann Arbor in addition to our present schedule. It is the judgment of the University officials that this additional tripper service will be necessary at the time the University of Michigan opens its school year on account of the new transportation regulations put in force this year by the University.

#### Route No. 1

South University, State St., North University, East University, South University, Washtenaw, Hill St., Oxford Rd., Geddes Ave., Oswego, returning via the same route. The tripper to arrive at State and North University at 7:58 a. m. and 8:58 a. m. and to leave State St. and North University at 12:05 p. m. six days per week.

#### Route No. 2

South University, East University, North University, State St. to the Ann Arbor Railroad tracks. A thirty minute service from 3:00 p. m. to 6:00 p. m. six days per week.

#### Route No. 3

Extend our present Washtenaw Line via Austin, Scottwood, Norway Rd. This is merely an extension of our present Washtenaw Loop.

We will agree to inaugurate these tripper services with the distinct understanding that if they are not properly patronized we will be permitted to withdraw same with one week's notice.

As it is desired that we inaugurate this service on Monday, September 19th, 1927, which does not give us time to appear before your Honorable Body, we hereby request that the Transportation Committee of your Honorable Body grant us temporary permission to

inaugurate this service on a test basis.
