

ABOUT THE CAST

ANITA BASSETT (Mrs. Baines) recently acted in two U of M mini-movies produced in the fall of '81 by Frank Beaver's Class in Film. She was in at least 30 plays at the Pasadena Playhouse during her youth. One part — that of Juliet, at age 14 — brought her in contact with the movie industry. Of four movie roles, her best was in Monogram Pictures' Hoosier Schoolboy, in which she played Mickey Rooney's girlfriend. Anita appeared as Emily in Our Town and as Nora in A Doll's House. She holds a Master's in music from the U of M and served as a T.A. at both U of M and Interlochen. Anita plays tennis, designs and hooks rugs, and travels whenever possible.

GEORGE BUFFORD (Charles Lomax) has appeared at the Michigan Opera Theater, the Croswell Opera House and the Black Sheep Theater. He has performed such diverse roles as Macheath in *The Threepenny Opera*, Condomine in *Blithe Spirit*, and Og in *Finian's Rainbow*. George holds a Master of Arts degree in Voice from Eastern Michigan University. He is the choir director at St. Luke's Episcopal Church, Ypsilanti, and teaches voice in Ann Arbor.

MIA CONDE (Jenny Hill) appeared as Mrs. Stephanos and a member of the Ensemble in last season's *My Fair Lady*. She has previously participated in AACT workshops. Mia enjoys art, ceramic sculpture and weaving as well as modern dance and contact improvisational dance. Off-stage, she is a registered nurse.

TOM DENNEHY (Adolphus Cusins) has previously appeared with Civic as Romainville in *Ring Round the Moon.* Dave Murray in *The Water Engine*, and Joey Biltmore in *Guys and Dolls.* Tom has also played roles in UAC-MUSKET productions of *The Music Man, Cabaret, West Side Story*, and *In The Dark.* Tom just completed his Master's degree in engineering at the U of M.

DAVID HARBISON (Peter Shirley) is marking his 22nd year of "off and on" participation in AACT productions. His most recent appearance was in the role of Ferraillon in last season's A Flea In Her Ear. Dave is president of Metal-Tronics, Inc., a local manufacturer's agency.

ED LESHER (Bilton) is a familiar face both on and offstage in Civic productions. He has worked on sets for over 10 years and finally got hooked on acting after appearing as a body in Arsenic and Old Lace. Ed received the Cameo award for the part of Bailey in The Night Thoreau Spent In Jail and most recently appeared on stage as Howie Newsome in Our Town and Baptisin in A Flea In Her Ear. He is a professor of aerospace at the U of M and designs, builds and flies airplanes.

LEO McNAMARA (Snobby Price) most recently appeared as Judge Gafney in *Harvey*, and last season as Emily's father in *Our Town* and the villain in *East Lynne*. He has taken many roles in theatre at the U of M and will appear in the forthcoming U of M PTP production of *Mary Stuart*. Leo is an associate professor of English at the U of M and is married to Deborah McNamara, this production's assistant director.

RICHARD MINER (Bill Walker), a graduate of Western Michigan University, has done numerous roles on Kalamazoo stages. He has also appeared in roles in Detroit and Illinois. Among his favorite plays are Marat/Sade, Playboy of the Western World, Five Finger Exercise, Indians, Man of La Mancha and Camelot. Richard enjoys athletics (as both a coach and player), philosophy, and writing.

SUSAN MORRIS (Barbara Undershaft) has appeared in quite a few AACT roles — including previous Shaw productions of *Misalliance* as Hypatia and *Arms and The Man* as Louka. She won Best Actress awards for Martha in *Arsenic and Old Lace* and Ghislain in *Waltz of the Toreadors*. Susan is a past board member and president of AACT. This year she directed the season opener — *Look Homeward*, *Angel* — and will direct Civic's production of *Camelot* in April. Susan is employed as a computer programmer at MDSI.

ROBERT NUISMER (Stephen Undershaft), having first appeared in the chorus of AACT's production of Follies, has since played Nathan Detroit in Guys and Dolls, and five roles in our Main Street production of The Good Doctor. Most recently, he directed and choreographed Once Upon a Mattress and served as artistic director for Civic's recent production of The Boyfriend.

TRACY PAUL (Sarah Undershaft), as a graduate of MSU, spent a term studying in England. Civic audiences saw her in AACT's Summer '80 season productions of *Still Life* and *The Night of January 16th*. Tracy has been a part of Black Sheep Repertory Theatre's 1981 season, appearing in *Blithe Spirit, The Mousetrap, Threepenny Opera*, and *Cinderella*.

BEVERLEY J. POOLEY (Andrew Undershaft) is a familiar face to Civic audiences. Since appearing in Civic's 1959 production of *Major Barbara* — in which he played Cusins — Bev has appeared in a variety of parts. His most recent roles include Burgoyne in *Devil's Disciple* and Ernst in *Bedroom Farce*. Ann Arbor audiences have seen him in several Gilbert and Sullivan Society productions. Bev is a professor of law and director of the Law Library at the U of M.

BONNI ROSEN-FINE (Rummy Mitchens) has been president of the Ypsilanti Players for over two years and has appeared in several productions with that group. Among her favorite roles are Ann Miller in 6 RM RIV VU, Elaine Navazio in Last of The Red Hot Lovers and Fiona Foster in How The Other Half Loves. Last year, Bonni appeared as Antoinette in A Flea In Her Ear with AACT. She is co-owner of And Everything Nice, a children's clothing and toy shop in Ypsilanti's historic Depot Town. She also serves on Ypsilanti's Cable Commission.

DWIGHT S. SMITH(Morrison) has helped build the set and run stage crew for every regular season production since joining AACT in 1976 as well as appearing in several main stage productions and studio productions. Dwight spends his non-theatre spare time working on automobiles, aircraft, his barn and selling synthetic lubricants.

CATHE WRIGHT (Lady Britomart) has played any number of maternal parts with AACT—Eliza Gant, mother of Eugene, in Look Homeward, Angel; Mrs. Gibbs, mother of George in Our Town, Leonora Armfeldt, mother of Desiree in A Little Night Music; Birdie, mother of Leo in The Little Foxes and Catherine, mother of Raina in Arms and The Man. She has also appeared as Anastasia in Anastasia, Penny (another mother!) in You Can't Take It With You, Josie Finn in Hogan's Goat, and Alays in Lion in Winter. Cathe is a mother of two boys—Anders and Nick—in her own Wright.

PATRICIA BALYSH (Properties) is serving in this capacity for the first time on a Civic Main Stage production.

THOM JOHNSON (Stage Manager) received his BA in speech from the U of M. He is a newcomer to AACT, but has done prior work as stage manager for the Romance Language Department's Spanish plays. Before moving to Ann Arbor, he was active in the Grand Rapids Civic Theatre.

CAROLYN LEWIS-STONE (Producer) is serving in this capacity for the second time this season. She is currently serving on Civic's Board of Directors and has been a long-time member of AACT backstage, onstage, and offstage. Carolyn is a psychiatric social worker by profession.

MIKE LIMMER (Light Design) designed lights for this season's production of *Harvey*, and has been active with Civic for the past two years. He designed lighting for Excalibur Productions, Little Known Players and the Village Players in Toledo before becoming involved with AACT. Mike manages the Burger King on Stadium Road here in Ann Arbor.

DEBORAH McNAMARA (Assistant Director) has been a Civic Theatre season ticket holder for 10 years. She appeared in *The Night of January 16th* on Main Street and in the Ensemble for last season's *Our Town*. She also served as the assistant director for *East Lynne*. GWENN ANGLE PROEGLER (Costume Design) is in her second season with AACT. Last year she designed costumes for *The Apollo of Bellac* as well as *East Lynne*. A 1960 graduate of Carnegie-Mellon in a theatre design major, Gwenn worked professionally as a designer.

ROBERTA RIZZARDI (Makeup Design) is again serving AACT as season makeup chair. Her most recent work for Civic included the makeup design for Look Homeward, Angel and The Boy Friend and crew member for Harvey, plus designs for last season's My Fair Lady, East Lynne and Bedroom Farce. 
