



#### ABOUT THE STAFF

JULIA BROXHOLM (Assistant Music Director) has appeared in the production of BRIGADOON with the AACT. She has performed in 6 major opera roles with the U of M. School of Music, Other groups include the Gilbert and Sullivan Society and the Comic Opera Guild. Julia has been a featured performer in 11 Arbecoll Theatrics shows including SOUTH PACIFIC, SIDE BY SIDE BY SONDHEIM, WAIT UNTIL DARK and more. Julia is a voice teacher and a solist with the First Presbyterian Church of Ann Arbor.

J. SCOTT CLARKE (Lighting Director) has performed this same duty in earlier shows including TEN LITTLE INDIANS and HAY FEVER. He has been lighting designer for other companies, including University Players, and American Theatre Productions where he worked CALIFORNIA SUITE and THE ELEPHANT MAN. Presently he is Technical Director for the Michigan Theater.

RUSSELL B. COLLINS (Stage Director) has produced, directed and designed for Arbecoll Theatrics. Some of his productions include: SIDE BY SIDE BY SONDHEIM, BELL, BOOK AND CANDLE, WAIT UNTIL DARK, BUTTERFLIES ARE FREE, SOUTH PACIFIC, THE GREAT AMERICAN MUSICAL and many more. Russell is presently managing director for the Michigan Theater, Ann Arbor's historic civic auditorium. Russell shares with us "It is a pleasure to work with Ann Arbor's most successful theatrical producer, The Ann Arbor Civic Theatre, in presenting FIDDLER ON THE ROOF."

CARL DAEHLER (Music Director) is no stranger to area concert and music goers. He has been music director of the Ann Arbor Chamber Orchestra since he founded the ensemble in 1978. During the 1983-84 season, Daehler led the orchestra in more than 70 performances including subscription concerts at the Michigan Theater, tour concerts throughout Michigan, education concerts, and the popular "Johann Strauss" concerts. Daehler is known throughout the country as an expert in the interpretation of original orchestra scores to silent films including the revival of such classics as ROBIN HOOD, DON JUAN, BROKEN BLOSSOMS, ORPHANS OF THE STORM, and THE BLACK PIRATE. His conducting of these scores with film has led to guest conducting appearances with the Seattle Symphony, Columbus (OH) Symphony, and the Orchestra of Illinois.

Although FIDDLER ON THE ROOF marks the first time Carl has been music director of an AACT show, he has been music director of more than ten stage shows presented by such area companies as Arbecoll Theatrics, Comic Opera Guild, UM Gilbert & Sullivan Society, and Ann Arbor Ballet Theater.

NANCY KATHLEEN DOYAL (Assistant Director) has acted as stage manager for the Graceful Arts Stage, Ann Arbor Art Fair 1983, and has performed with the Marshall Civic Theatre in the production of THE KING AND I. Nancy is currently working as the Administrative Assistant at the Michigan Theater.

MARILYN KENNEDY (Producer) began her AACT career on stage in productions such as CAROUSEL, CAMELOT and THE SOUND OF MUSIC. She has expanded her interests in the past few years to include set dressing and producing as well. She has also performed and produced for Comic Opera Guild in shows which include DESERT SONG, NAUGHTY MARIETTA and THE MERRY WIDOW. She is on the Board of Directors of both organizations and works in advertising in "real life."

**THOM JOHNSON** (Stage Manager) has worked in many capacities at AACT. He acted in previous year's productions of BUTTERFLIES ARE FREE and ON GOLDEN POND. He directed OFF AND RUNNING for AACT's Main Street Theatre and designed lights for THE CLUB, also at Main Street Theatre. T. J. has also designed lights for dance programs at Performance Network, Trueblood and U of M Dance Department.

MARY LEYENDECKER (Costume Designer) This is Mary's first production with AACT. She has been a designer for two Huron High School Productions: BYE, BYE BIRDIE and SEASCAPE. Mary currently is a costume technician at the University of Michigan Power Center shop.

**MIKE LIMMER** (Production Assistant) has worked lights for many AACT shows (recent productions include, SEVEN KEYS TO BALDPATE and THE DIVINERS). Mike has also helped with costumes and sets. He is a current AACT board member. Mike has also worked with many theatre groups in Toledo.

JIM POSANTE (Choreographer) has served as director/choreographer for HOW THE OTHER HALF LOVES, CAROUSEL, THE ROBBER BRIDEGROOM, OKLAHOMA, GUYS AND DOLLS, and as director for PIPPIN for AACT (the last three shows winning AACT's Best Musical Award). He was guest director/Choreographer on JESUS CHRIST SUPERSTAR IN Yorkton, Saskatchawan, and has performed those same duties at Greenhills School for seven years. Theatre Guild for Livonia-Redford has utilized Jim's talents as director/choreographer on HOW TO SUCCEED IN BUSINESS..., THE ROBBER BRIDEGROOM and CHIGAGO. She has since worked and/or designed make-up for over thirty AACT shows. Roberta has done make-up for many University of Michigan Opera Theater productions, the Dexter Players and several area high schools. She is an art teacher in the Dexter Community School District.

**RICHARD EVANS** (Builder/Tech. Director) This marks his first production with AACT, and his first theatrical production ever! Richard works as the building manager at the Michigan Theater.


