THE STAFF

JAMES POSANTE (Director/Choreographer) has directed a multitude of plays and musicals. Starting in 1974 with *H.M.S Pinafore* (for UMGASS), he has directed **at least** 5 shows a year. Most recently he was the director/choreographer for AÅCT's *Bells Are Ringing*. Jim directed the '82 production of *Bridegroom* for the AACT Main Street Summer Season.

BRADLEY BLOOM (Musical Director) has performed this same duty on Anything Goes, Company, A Little Night Music, Once Upon A Mattress and Hello Dolly for AACT. He is the Director of Choral Activities at Schoolcraft College and Music Director for Ann Arbor Cantata Singers.

MELISSA FORSTNER (Asst. Director) Melissa recently graduated with a degree in English from Northwestern University. There she co-directed, choreographed and danced for the Graffiti Dancers. She plans to attend U of M Law School in the fall.

KATHLEEN HARSEN (Producer/Townsperson) is a returning cast member from the 1982 AACT production of The Robber Bridegroom. Kathleen has also appeared in the AACT production of The Sound Of Music and the Gilbert & Sullivan Society's production of Utopia Limited. In addition to her performance abilities, Kathleen is the Publicity Chairperson for AACT. She has also produced numerous productions for AACT and when she isn't spending time on a production, Kathleen is an account representative for WAAM Radio.

CHARLIE SUTHERLAND (Set Designer) designed the set for the Main Street Production of The Robber Bridegroom. He also did scenes for The Late Inspector Hound, Bus Stop, The Rainmaker and Steambath at AACT Main Street. Charlie also directed The Late Christopher Bean and appeared in The Shadow Box, The Importance of Being Earnest and Bells Are Ringing. Charlie teachs third-grade in Detroit.

GWEN PROEGLER (Costumer) is a 1960 graduate of Carnegie Mellon's Theatre Design Department. This is her tenth show for AACT, having designed *Butterflies Are Free, The Philadelphia Story, Hello Dolly* and *Bells Are Ringing.* This season Gwen won AACT's award for Best Costume Design for *Bells Are Ringing.*

MARY COLE (Lighting Designer) has a MFA in Lighting Design from the University of Michigan. Mary had designed lights for H.M.S. Pinafore for the Gilbert & Sullivan Society, the Eastern Michigan University Dance Concert 1985 and Dance Theatre II. Her work with AACT includes lighting design for How The Other Half Loves, The Late Christopher Bean and Bells Are Ringing. Mary is currently doing freelance lighting designs while he is writing her thesis. Her newest hobby is star-gazing through her telescope.

DAVID LAU (Audio Engineer) owns and operates The Brookwood Studio, Inc., which does audio and video taping for local groups, advertising and industrial clients, and major record labels. He also teaches courses in audio recording techniques at Eastern Michigan University and Bowling Green State University in Ohio. He finds technical sound reinforcement enjoyable and challenging because the goal is usually for the show to sound "like it wasn't miked at all." Previous theatrical sound experience ranges from *Hello Dolly* also for AACT, to *Hair to Bells Are Ringing*. David volunteers as a board member and officer of the Michigan Theater.

JOHN JARRETT (Accompanist) just finished Bells Are Ringing for AACT as accompanist and orchestra member. Recently he also did the accompaniment for The Appletree, Hello Dolly, Working, and Fiddler On The Roof. John has accompanied for the Thurston Player productions and is a pianist at the Studio 1 School of Dance.

ROBERTA RIZZARDI (*Make-Up*) is again serving as Makeup Chair for AACT. She worked on her first performance *Fiorellol* in 1975. She has since worked and/or designed makeup for over thirty AACT shows, her latest being *Bells Are Ringing*. Roberta has done makeup for many University of Michigan Opera Theatre Productions, the Dexter Players and several area high schools. She is an art teacher in the Dexter Community School District.

HONORAH MARTONE (Stage Manager) Norah has stage managed many shows for AACT including Bells Are Ringing, Working, Hello Dolly, and Cabaret. She has also stage managed for the University of Michigan Gilbert and Sullivan Society. Norah is a theatre production major at Boston University's School for the Arts.

THE CAST

RICH ROSELLE (Jamie Lockhart) Although Rich has appeared in many AACT shows such as Bedroom Farce, Camelot, See How They Run, How The Other Half Loves, Bells Are Ringing and more, the most exciting theatre experience Rich says he's ever had is being able to play Jamie Lockhart in The Robber Bridegroom again.

JAMES PIPER (Clement Musgrove) recently appeared as Stephen Kodalay in the UM Muscial Society's production of She Loves Me. He held other leads in the AACT productions of The Philadelphia Story, Harvey and a previous production of The Robber Bridegroom when he also played Clement Musgrove.

SUSAN DAWSON (Rosanund) moved to Ann Arbor from Florida when she was awarded a PTP Fellowship in the UM Graduate Theatre Department. She loved Ann Arbor so much she stayed, and since then has been seen in numerous Civic productions including *Guys and Dolls*, for which she won the Best Actress Award. Susan also sings swing jazz with several local groups including *Misbehavin'* and The Howard White Trio. By day, she is Director of Administration and Advertising for Data Scan, a local firm.

JANE HASSINGER (Salome) This is Jane's second performance with AACT. The first was as Salome in our 1982 production of *The Robber Bridegroom*. Jane is the founding member of the musical group, *Misbehavin'*. While at U of M, Jane appeared in several UMGAS productions such as; *Oliver, H.M.S. Pinafore*, and *The Pirates of Penzance*. Jane works at U of M as a clinical social worker. Jane's latest production is her beautiful daughter. JAMES A. NEWTON (*Little Harp*) James has done a variety of productions with various local theatre groups — in various roles. He has a variety of varied interests in which he dabbles at various times. He is employed as an engineering technician at a local company where he performs...various tasks.

WILLIAM D. LING (Big Harp) William has performed with both the Comic Opera Guild and U of M Gilbert and Sullivan Society in productions of *Les Brigands, Gondoliers, Iolanthe* and others. TIM CHRISTENSEN (Caller) has no prior experience as a caller but he square danced extensively in his grade school gym class. He has worked with theatre groups on and off all of his life, mostly as a piano player. Tim is an MBA student and financial aide officer at U of M.

GLEN COOLEY (The Landlord) was last seen in the chorus of U of M Gilbert and Sullivan Society's Princess Ida where he also served as Costume Designer. In addition to his extensive G&S work, Glen has also found time for performing with AACT in Apple Tree. When not up to his neck in theatre, he can be found with his feet firmly planted in English soil.

SHARON SUSSMAN has performed in several Civic productions, including Uncommon Women and Others, Once Upon a Mattress and Bells Are Ringing. She is also very involved in the G&S Society and, in her spare time, is a computer graphics consultant for Ford Motor Company in Dearborn.
