



ABOUT THE CAST

TERRANCE AUCH (Original Music) has been playing guitar and singing folk music for 24 years. Terrance has worked as a director for the Black Sheep Theatre, has acted with The Performance Network and The Comic Opera Guild. He was previously an instructor at Eastern Michigan University and has produced radio and TV films.

SKIP BAILEY (Hallboy) appeared in YOU CAN'T TAKE IT WITH YOU when he was in high school. He plays the drums, and likes bicycling and camping.

ROBIN BARLOW (Anthony Cavendish) has appeared in such AACT productions as A FLEA IN HER EAR, LOOK HOMEWARD, ANGEL, THE CHALK GARDEN, ON GOLDEN POND and A MIDSUMMER NIGHT'S DREAM. Robin is a professor of economics at the University of Michigan, where he is also director of the Center for Research on Economic Development. This is his sixth play for the Civic Theatre. He has twice received Civic's Best Actor Award. In Ann Arbor he has also appeared in productions of the St. Andrew's Players, and in his native England has acted in London, Oxford, and Windsor.

ANITA BASSETT (Miss Peake) finds acting to be a continuing refreshment, especially ensemble acting. You may have chuckled at her portrayal of May in THE PHILADELPHIA STORY. Since then she has been in THE GIFT, a University of Michigan Film Department exercise writen and directed by Shirley Peeples, and in AACT's THE DIVINERS.

CHRISTOPHER FLYNN (Jo) has appeared in many plays for AACT, and has directed or choreographed several others. Most recently he appeared in a confusing multiplicity of roles in THE DINING ROOM on Main Street.

TOM FRANKS, JR. (Herbert Dean) Tom's previous AACT experience has been as Hayden in SEVEN KEYS TO BALDPATE, and (for the St. Andrew's Players) as a reader in THE WAY OF THE CROSS by Gabriel Marcel. Recently he worked on the play selection committee (1985-86) and helped with the annual meeting. Tom works as a Professor of Philosophy at EMU where he teaches Philosophy of Art and Recent European Philosophy.

K. JOHN JARRETT (Incidental Piano Music) John's previous AACT activities include pianist for HELLO DOLLY, APPLE TREE and FIDDLER ON THE ROOF, as well as working on OKLAHOMA!, LITTLE MARY SUNSHINE, SPOFFORD, and BRIGADOON. John was the Assistant Music Director for the Thurston Players from 1982 to this year. John also has a special interest in the music of Gershwin, and is the new AACT Treasurer.

MARILYN KENNEDY (Della) has been active in AACT for the past seven years in several capacities, including actress, producer, set-dresser, and poster/program designer. She also serves on the Board of Directors of both AACT and Comic Opera uild. Her most recent appearance for AACT was in THE ROBBER BRIDEGROOM this summer. In "real" life She works in graphics and advertising with a local firm.

ED LESHER (Hallboy) is no stranger to AACT, having appeared over the years in 24 separate parts "mostly small." He has also assisted in set construction, as well as having been part of move-in and strike crews.

ROBERT MacGREGOR (McDermott/Gunga) has had wide stage experience, having appeared in over a dozen operettas and musicals with The U of M Gilbert & Sullivan Society, The Comic Opera Guild and AACT. He was Lord Tolliver in IOLANTHE with The Gilbert & Sullivan Society and Anthony Marston in TEN LITTLE INDIANS with the Black Sheep Repertory Theatre. His recent AACT experience includes FIDDLER ON THE ROOF (Russian Singer) and BELLS ARE RINGING (Charles Bessemer). Bob enjoys water skiing, softball, and researching the history of U of M football.

FRANCES MARTONE (Kitty) stumbled into AACT about three years ago little suspecting she would find true love and happiness. Fran has filled her hours since then on-stage in THE SHADOW BOX (Maggie), STEAMBATH (Meridith), OFF AND RUNNING (Della), and WITNESS FOR THE PROSECUTION (Greta), directing KEY EXCHANGE, serving as a Board member, chairing the 1985 play selection committee, editing the SPOTLIGHT, ushering, prop running, sewing, painting and trying to learn how to wield a hammer. Fran's favorite production was in June of 1985 as a Member of the Wedding (her own).

DAVID RENKIN (Perry Stewart) is a graduate of Duke University ('83). He is currently in his second year of medical school. Previous AACT productions include HELLO DOLLY, WORKING (as Fireman and Trucker), and most recently ROBBER BRIDEGROOM (as Goat). In all his spare time, David enjoys sports, running, and marathoning.

STEVEN SKELLEY (Gilbert Marshall) This is Steven's first venture with AACT, although he has had previous experience with the Black Sheep Repertory Theatre in PRISONER OF SECOND AVENUE. Steven has lived in Ann Arbor for the past twenty-three years, during which he has worked at WUOM in various capacities. Currently, in addition to producing afternoon musicale, he serves as station music director.

DWIGHT S. SMITH (Chauffeur) has participated in practically every play AACT has produced since he joined in 1976. He is an AMSOIL dealer whose hobbies include philanthropy, his Presidential campaign, airplanes and barn building.

JOHN STEVENS (Oscar Wolfe) has been acting on the stage for 22 years. This play will mark his 19th performance for AACT audiences. He has played every kind of role from Crazy Teddy in ARSENIC AND OLD LACE to Grandpaw in YOU CAN'T TAKE IT WITH YOU and has even been an Indian in ANNIE GET YOUR GUN. In his first play he was cast in the leading role in GEORGE WASHINGTON SLEPT HERE. This was way back in 1962 and since then has gone on to play in over 40 productions with various groups in southeast Michigan. When not acting, John likes to sail. He has sailed in Maine and on the Great Lakes. One year he crewed in the Port Huron to Mackinaw Race. John and his wife, Chris now sail their boat at Woodland Lake, near Brighton.

SHARON SUSSMAN Gwen Cavendish) has worked with the U of M Gilbert & Sullivan Society in such productions as THE SORCERER, YEOMEN OF THE GUARD, H.M.S. PINAFORE, and THE GONDOLIERS, where she was choreographer. Her extensive AACT experience includes ROBBER BRIDGROOM (Townsperson), BELLS ARE RINGING (Chorus Dancer) UNCOMMON WOMEN AND OTHERS (Kate) and ONCE UPON A MATTRESS (Lady Larkin). For recreation, Sharon enjoys dancing, going to the movies, reading, horseback riding, and playing the piano.

PHYLLIS WRIGHT (Fanny Cavendish) A former Board member of AACT, Phyllis' acting or directing credits include BARRETTS OF WIMPOLE ST., JANUS, the 1st production of MAJOR BARBARA, and THE LATE CHRISTOPHER BEAN. She is a Docent at the U of M Museum of Art and Works as a trustee for the Ann Arbor Summer Festival.

ABOUT THE STAFF

EDITH LEAVIS BOOKSTEIN (Costume Designer) is completing an M.F.A. in Costume Design at the U of M this year. She has worked both locally and nationally: designing THE CRUCIBLE for the U of M Power Series, AMAHL AND THE NIGHT VISITORS for the St. Andrew's Players and L' ELISIR D'AMORE for the EMU Opera Workshop this season, and acting as assistant designer on network television shows including the Emmy-Award-winning GROWING PAINS for Metro-Media Playhouse and a Captain Kangaroo prime-time special this spring. Ede designed THE CURIOUS SAVAGE for Civic Theatre in 1980. The Booksteins have two daughters and a new chocolate-colored Lab at home.

FAITH M. DUEDE (Lighting Designer) is a junior at Ypsilanti high school who has been in theatre since age 4, on stage as well as behind the scenes.
