BLOOD WEDDING combines music, poetry, dance, and visual effects to create moods ranging from passionate and joyful to sublimely tragic. Set in rural Spain, the play revolves around a young girl, caught between two feuding families, struggling to find her own road in a society that has already marked out her path. The mood of the play creates an enthralling experience, combining music, dance, and visual effects with a compelling story of unfillable desire.

Originally from southern Spain, Lorca's work was received with great critical acclaim, especially in the United States where he lived for some time. He was a friend of Salvador Dali, to whom he dedicated some of his poetry. The profound influence of the surrealist movement on his work is evident in the play's sensuous, dreamlike sequences. Lorca was assassinated during the Spanish Civil War.
