



Leslie Austin (Chorus) Leslie has been absent from the stage since playing the lead in Winnie the Pooh at the age of nine. She is thankful for this opportunity to salvage her theatrical reputation.

Dave Barais (Chorus) Dave has appeared in A Chorus Line, Gypsy, Fiddler on the Roof, and Godspell all for the Chelsea Area Players. He is employed at the Purple Rose Theatre Co.

Joseph Beauregard (Stewpot) Joe is making his debut with AACT. A composition student at Western, he has performed in the past with community theatres in both Whitmore Lake and Dexter.

Kevin Binkley (Lt. Cable) This is Kevin's second role with AACT. He played Curly in last seasons production of Oklahomal. His prior performances have been primarily in the Jackson area where he works as Treasurer for Jacobson's.
