



From the Director

On the Town tells the story of three WWII sailors on leave in New York City for what turns out to be a 24-hour adventure. Chip, Ozzie and Gabey set out to have as much fun as they can squeeze into their limited time in New York. Chip plans to see as many sights as possible (using his out-dated guide book), Ozzie plans to meet lots of girls and kick up his heels, and Gabey, the most serious of the three, hopes to fall in love.

Perfectly set in the hustle and bustle of one of America's greatest cities, On the Town highlights many of the city's famous sites, including Times Square, Central Park, the Museum of Natural History, and Carnegie Hall. The show's ensemble plays a crucial role in capturing the look and feel of this busy city, since most NYC streets are filled with constant activity and passersby.

My overall vision for On the Town was inspired by 1940's B&W photographs and movies that have been color-tinted with primary and pastel colors. For me, these pictures depict a romantic time in history, when innocence and naivety still existed between love relationships. There also seems to have been an urgency to "fall in love," especially for servicemen, who were likely hoping to meet a girl or even get married before they left for the war, because there was the sad possibility that they may not survive to have another chance at love. Gabey's character in On the Town epitomizes this poignant innocence when, after setting his heart on a girl he sees on a subway poster, he makes finding Ivy Smith take precedence over anything else he does in NYC. Now that's what I call "love at first sight!"

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
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
