Twenty-first Program

Alwin Nikolais is a revolutionary figure in dance. Turning away from the earlier, traditional modern dance, he created an entirely new form of multimedia with a much broader conceptual basis. Utilizing new concepts of time and space in relation to dance, Nikolais revised and extended the technical study and creative practices of modern dance, leading Clive Barnes of the New York *Times* to call it "... a new world of one man's creation [with] the hallmark of genius ... the greatest pure showman in American theatre."

Nikolais was appointed director of the Henry Street Playhouse in New York City in 1948, and it was here that he began to develop his new concepts and to form a company of his own. Today the Nikolais Dance Theatre regularly performs in the great theaters of the world, often under U.S. Department of State sponsorship, and tours coast-to-coast in the United States and Canada in addition to its regular New York seasons.

This week's activities of the Nikolais Dance Theatre comprise a half-week dance residency, including a slide-show demonstration (March 20), two concert performances, and master classes in the University Dance Department, with support from the National Endowment for the Arts and Michigan Council for the Arts.
